Who May Apply:	Open to all qualified United States Citizens who are currently not employed with Military Sealift Fleet Support Command (MSFSC) as civil service mariner (CIVMAR) employees. Relocation expenses are not authorized for this position.		
Duties:	<p>The Second Officer (Watch) is the Navigation Officer responsible for the navigational operations, reports, equipment, supplies, maintenance and resources of the ship. The 2/O also provides training to all watch personnel on bridge in safe navigational practices and in the proper use of navigational equipment to include deck alarm systems, fixed fire, smoke, flooding systems, security rounds and systems, and gangway watch procedures. Ensures that all standard navigation day's work is performed by all watches and that operational checklists are maintained. The Second Officer (Cargo) is responsible for the operational readiness of all rig crews, underway replenishment gear, all running and standing gear, and the stowage and condition of the cargo holds on Cargo Vessels. During vertical replenishment (VERTREP), ensures proper methodology of helicopter cargo and personnel transfer is used, that cargo is properly staged and weighed, readied for transfer, color coded and transferred to appropriate destination. In addition the 2/O onboard Ammunition capable vessels is the Retail Ordnance Logistics Management System (ROLMS) Administrator and ensures proper entry for the requisitioning, receiving, and issuing of all conventional type ammunition. On Oilers, the Second Officer will act as Tankerman-PIC (person-in-charge), and be responsible for the loading/discharging of cargo petroleum products. The Second Officer Operations-Officer (OPSO) is the designated position replacing the Military Detachment Officer-in-Charge and is responsible for the scheduling of operational tasking and harbor movements, naval message operational traffic, tactical maneuvering coordination and communication underway, and Helicopter Control Officer (HCO). Performs other duties as required.</p>

Transportation Worker Identification Credential (TWIC) card with a minimum of 10 months remaining of expiration date. 4. Licensing/Certification requirements: USCG license endorsed as: Second Mate of Steam and Motor Vessels of Any Gross Tons Upon Oceans or Near Coastal waters (or higher), and Radar Observer Unlimited. 5. STCW certificate endorsed as: Capacity as - Officer-In-Charge of a Navigation Watch, or Chief Mate, or Master; STCW may not include limitations of validity on vessels operating in the GMDSS system, or aboard ARPA or radar-equipped vessels. 6. A Federal Communications Commission GMDSS Radio Operator's License/certificate. 		
Evaluation Criteria:	Applicants who meet the Minimum Eligibility Requirements described above will be further evaluated. Documented experience, education, training, and awards contained in the application package will be reviewed to determine the degree to which you possess the required knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSAs) that are essential to perform the duties and responsibilities of the

A rating determination will be conducted against the knowledge, skills and abilities to determine your qualifications as reflected by your responses to the following job related factors:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Knowledge of navigation methods, equipment and techniques. 2. Skill in oral and written communication to include using shipboard computer systems and programs. 3. Ability to interpret and analyze information, make decisions, plan, organize, evaluate and supervise the work of others. 4. Knowledge of shipboard safety and security programs, including lifesaving and fire fighting equipment, methods and techniques. 5. Knowledge of cargo operations including those involving dry stores, munitions, petroleum products and helo operations (VERTREP). 6. Knowledge of ammunition administration, cargo fuel quality assurance and accounting, special mission ship operations, towing and salvage operations, or fleet support operations as Operations Officer (OPSO). <p>Although not required for consideration, candidates that hold Tankerman PIC (person in charge)/DL (dangerous liquids), or the appropriate Towing credentials as specified in 46 CFR 15.805(a)(5), Towing Officers Assessment Record (TOAR), possess credentials or certificates demonstrating proficiency with unusual and technical shipboard operations systems and programs such as Dynamic Positioning (DP) Systems, salvage operations, cable operations, command ship operations, or foreign naval auxiliary operations shall provide that information on the Promotion Application form.</p> <p>Evaluations, awards, training, education, and related MSC, military, and/or commercial experience, etc., will also be part of the rating process.</p>
<p>Conditions of Employment</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. CIVMAR positions are subject to drug urinalysis testing. 2. Able to obtain and maintain security clearance eligibility and assignment to a sensitive position. 3. Able to successfully pass the physical examinations (arranged by MSC) and maintain MSFSC medical requirements. Participate in vaccine immunization; including a tuberculosis (TB) screening test is also required. TB screening is not provided at the MSC-arranged medical examination, but can usually be obtained from your personal medical provider or free at any local Public Health Clinic. If you have previously had a positive TB skin test (i.e. a CONVERTER or REACTOR), another skin test is not required, but you must instead provide the Medical Department written proof that you have completed treatment with medicine (i.e. INH), or that you have started treatment with medicine, or that such treatment is not warranted as determined by competent medical authority. 4. Attend and successfully complete all mandatory training courses, including Personal Survival, which requires the ability to float in the water for a minimum of 60 seconds. 5. Be ready, willing, and able to physically perform the duty of this position worldwide at all times. 6. Be ready, willing, and able to work in shipboard environmental conditions, and wear protective equipment worldwide at all times. 7. Entry-level positions require candidates to pass an English Language Competency Test. 8. Participate in direct deposit/electronic funds transfer as the standard method of payroll payments. 9. If you answered yes to Questions 9 and/or 11; or have current or pending criminal charges and/or charges for any violation of law, court abstracts from the Clerk of Courts are required.
3. A current United States Coast Guard Merchant Mariner's Document (MMD), front and back or Merchant Mariner Credential (MMC), all pages and front and back copy of the Transportation Worker Identification Credential (TWIC) with a minimum of ten months remaining of expiration date.
4. A front and back copy of your current United States Coast Guard license, and/or STCW certificate with a minimum of ten months remaining of expiration date, if applicable.
5. A current U. S. Passport with a minimum of seven months remaining of expiration date.
6. A copy of professional certificates as applicable for this position.
7. If you are a current federal employee, you must include a copy of your most recent Notice of Personnel Action (SF-50).
8. If you are a prior federal government employee, you must include a copy of your separation Notice of Personnel Action (SF-50).
9. If you served in the U.S. Military Service, you must provide a copy of your Certificate of Discharge (DD214) that shows the type of discharge you received. This information is located under the "Character of Service" block of your DD214.
